In 2020, the Interstate Commission for Adult Offender Supervision (ICAOS) partnered with SEARCH on a Justice Reinvestment Grant from the Bureau of Justice Assistance. The project's goals extend the ICAOS Interstate Compact Offenders under Transfer System (ICOTS) with new innovative capabilities. Panelists in this session will discuss why supervision officials require access to timely information on offenders under their supervision even when they have transferred supervision to another jurisdiction, and the challenges agencies currently face; how the automated enrollment and subscription notification services will promote expanded data sharing and improve public and officer safety; will provide an overview of the architectural design that facilitates information sharing, enrollment, and subscription notification functions that are fully CJIS-compliant; and finally, will address how the public/private partnership between ICAOS, SEARCH, and the pilot states of Kansas, Arizona, and Ohio produces greater efficiency and effectiveness, and enhances public and officer safety.







