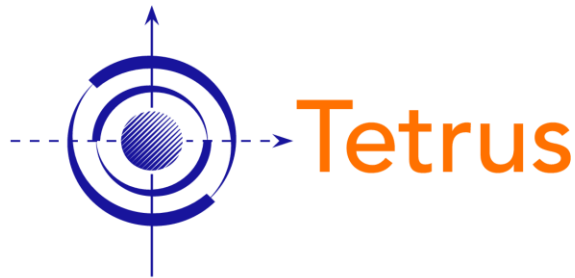

This insightful session will reveal how alert and detection technologies can play a critical role in enhancing organizational readiness for active-shooter situations in schools, the workplace and other secure environments by helping to prevent, or appropriately respond, to situations that increase the criticality and potential loss of life experienced during these events. In addition to gun violence, Corrections (jails and prisons) and the surrounding communities are now facing gang drug threats related to contraband and drone delivery space. As the frequency of critical events continues to rise with increased gun violence and gang and cartel related activities, the use of today's technology can be paramount to the safety and security of the Justice and Public Safety mission. Awareness, knowledge, and the development of an enhanced secure environment through the use of today's technology capabilities, provides actionable insights into fortifying organizational preparedness. While the



FAA 100% regulates air safety and drone flights, you will learn how GA DOC reacted to the increased threat to security and deployed technology to comply with laws regulating where drones can fly, and also how the use of drone detection technology by multiple agencies is used to apprehend and prosecute. In each of these scenarios, it becomes evident that our dynamic use of new technology can prevent these events, but collaboration is required as a collective effort to ensure a swift, effective, and well-coordinated response.

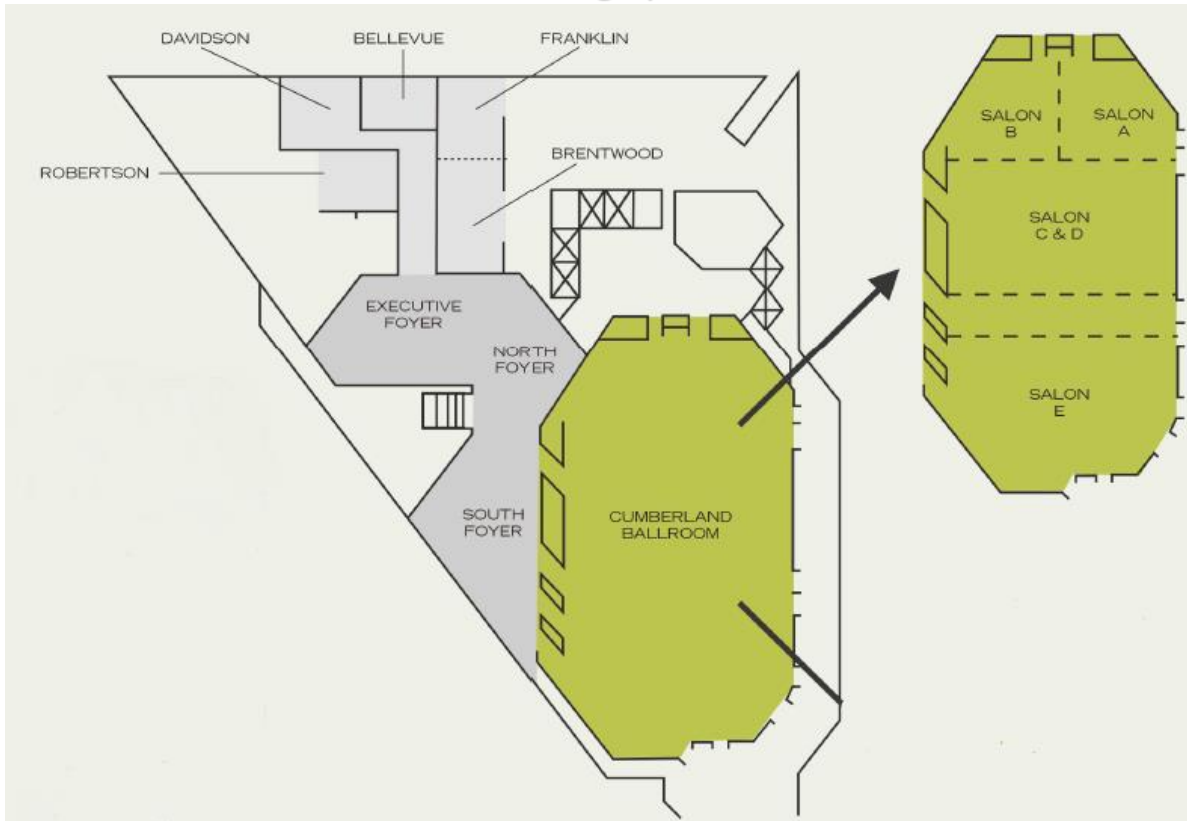

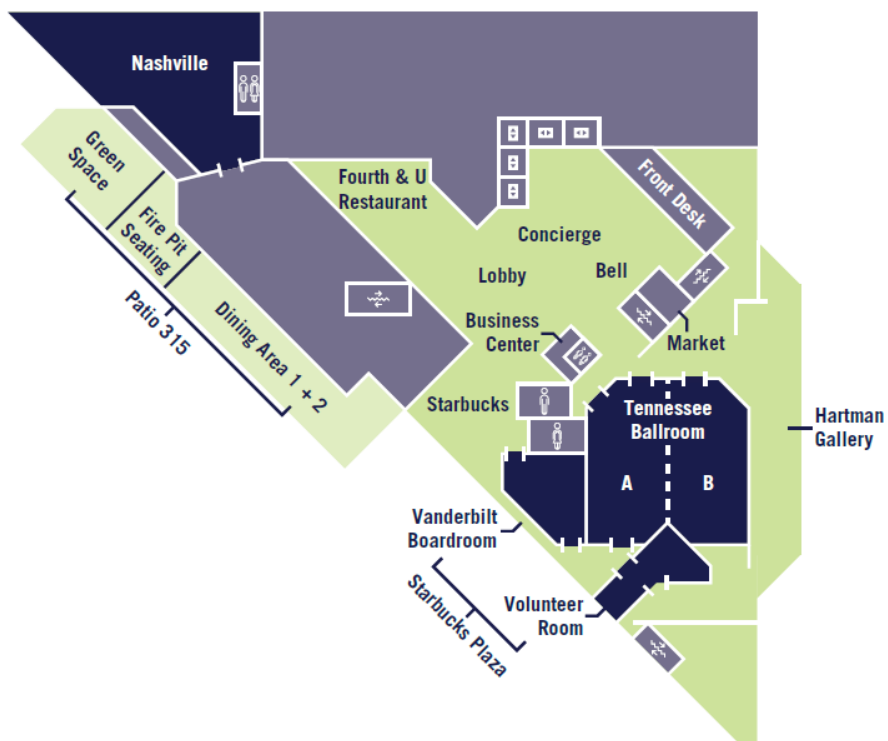
